Islands of the Indian Ocean aboard the 59-cabin *Island Sky* **NOVEMBER 7-23, 2025**


Dear Princetonian,

THIS IS AN EXTRAORDINARY EXPEDITION for travelers who love the natural world and all its wonders. Located in the heart of the Indian Ocean, the 115 islands that make up the Seychelles are known for crystal-clear waters, endless stretches of powdery white-sand beaches, a diverse and vibrant marine ecosystem, and endemic plant and animal species.

Begin with two days in Mahé, the largest and most populous island in the Seychelles archipelago. With pristine beaches, lush forests, and dramatic mountains, it is a tropical paradise with a unique culture that blends African, French, and British influences. Then embark the 59-cabin Island Sky and venture to the Outer Islands, the remote Alphonse group, and finally to Aldabra, a vast coral atoll that is home to the world's largest population of giant tortoises.

Continue to Madagascar, a thousand-mile island boasting an impressive variety of spectacular landscapes, from pristine coral reefs and coastal mangroves to virgin rainforests and native groves of Baobab trees. Geographically isolated for millions of years, nearly all of Madagascar's intriguing animals and plants are found nowhere else on Earth, including its nearly 100 varieties of lemurs. A team of experienced naturalists will guide you as you explore these unique ecosystems, leading nature walks and snorkeling excursions among colorful reef fish, coral formations, and marine creatures.

This journey features a robust academic program presented by an outstanding line-up of faculty speakers, including Princeton's Daniel Rubenstein, Class of 1877 Professor of Zoology. You will have the opportunity to learn about the ecology, perspectives. Participants will be joined on this program by like-minded travelers from Dartmouth, Harvard, and Yale. For those wishing to continue the adventure, a post-trip extension near Kruger National Park, South Africa, will be offered.

Study Leader

Daniel Rubenstein Class of 1877 Professor of Zoology, Emeritus

Professor Rubenstein's research focuses on decision-making in animals. He studies how an individual's foraging, mating and social behavior are influenced by its phenotype, by ecological circumstances, and by the actions of other individuals in the population. He develops simple mathematical models to generate predictions that

can be tested using data gathered from structured field observations or experimental manipulations. In this way Rubenstein searches for general principles, or 'rules', that underlie complex patterns of behavior. On this journey, Professor Rubenstein will discuss his recent findings on the social behavior of lemurs and zebras, as well as topics in African conservation.





Mahé, Seychelles

Settle into the Savoy Resort & Spa, located on Beau Vallon Beach, where you'll find elegantly appointed rooms equipped with a private balcony or terrace. Gather with fellow travelers this evening for a welcome reception and orientation.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 10

Mahé

Tour Le Jardin Du Roi Spice Garden, featuring vibrant tropical flowers, fragrant herbs, exotic spices, and medicinal plants, while learning how the Seychelles once stood at the center of the spice trade in the 18th century. Then visit the National Museum of History, which offers informative exhibits on Seychellois Creole culture and heritage. Board the Island Sky this afternoon and enjoy the captain's welcome reception this evening before dinner. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 11

Praslin Island

Spend the morning on Praslin exploring the Vallée de Mai, the last remnant of the original high-canopied Seychelles palm forest. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is home to the endemic and endangered coco de mer palm tree, as well as the rare black parrot. In the afternoon, enjoy a walk along the beach and in the forest on an uninhabited island, followed by an opportunity to snorkel among hawksbill and green turtles. to Johannesburg

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 12

Alphonse Islands

In the morning, cruise to the three islands of the Alphonse group, located directly south of the Amirantes and considered by many to be the most beautiful of the 115 islands in the Seychelles archipelago. Conditions permitting, call at the idyllic island of Bijoutier, home to a wide variety of seabirds. Snorkel in the crystalclear waters after exploring by foot. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 13

At Sea

Enjoy a full day at sea to experience the amenities of the ship and attend the lecture series while cruising to the Outer Seychelles Islands. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 14

Aldabra Group, Outer Seychelles

Visit Aldabra, a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1982 and the world's largest coral atoll, home to the largest population of giant tortoises. This vast atoll consists of a ring of four reef islands surrounding a massive emerald lagoon, with channels linking the lagoon to the ocean. Explore the crystal-clear waters of the lagoon on Zodiacs and snorkel among the vibrant coral reefs teeming Mahé with marine life. Therese

Nosy Hara National Park, Madagascar Nosy Hara means "mountainous island" in Malagasy and is considered one of the last true paradises of Madagascar. The island features a stunning bay, sandy beaches, and unique, sharply eroded limestone spikes known as

Hike the shorter Brookesia Micra Circuit in search of chameleons and other animals, or take the steeper route on the longer Tsingy Mitsiry Circuit to see the Tsingy formations, ending with a sweeping viewpoint. Spend the afternoon relaxing on one of the park's beautiful beaches. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 17

Nosy Tanikely, Madagascar

Delight in a morning snorkeling excursion at Nosy Tanikely's marine reserve, recognized for its outstanding marine biodiversity, featuring a spectacular coral reef teeming with colorful fish and other sea creatures. In the afternoon, enjoy cruising and the continuation of the lecture series. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 18

Mahajanga, Madagascar

This morning, visit "Lac Sacre", or Sacred Lake, and learn about the spiritual significance of its clear waters and special trees planted on the lakeshore, which are venerated by the local people. Walk through the nearby mango trees to observe the sifaka lemurs, iguanas, lizards, and colorful birds that reside there. This afternoon, you will have the chance to swim at a beachside resort before returning to the ship. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 19

At Sea

During a day at sea, enjoy the continuation of the lecture series and the amenities of the *Island Sky* as it cruises to Morandava. *ISLAND SKY* (B,L,D)

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 20

Morandava, Madagascar

Zodiac to shore and enjoy a choice of excursions for an Avenue of Baobabs walk, followed by a specially arranged visit to the Zazamalala Forest Reserve and Botanical Garden. Established in 2000, the reserve's staff harvest seeds as part of an extensive community reforestation effort and run a turtle breeding program. During a forest walk, observe and learn about the 11 species of lemurs, 5 species of chameleons, and numerous rare bird species that reside here. *ISLAND SKY* (B,L,D)

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 21

Toliara, Madagascar

Today, visit the curious spiny forest region, a unique ecosystem found only in the southern part of Madagascar, and view the spectacular baobab trees at Reniala Private Reserve. The reserve is a paradise for birds and is home to the grey mouse lemur, radiated tortoise, and warty chameleon. Enjoy the captain's farewell reception and dinner this evening. *ISLAND SKY* (B,L,D)

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 22

Toliara, Madagascar / Disembark

Enjoy a guided visit to Antsokay Arboretum, which protects 900 species of endemic plants. Transfer to the airport for a charter flight to Johannesburg, South Africa, for onward flights back to the U.S. (B.L)




Island Sky

The Island Sky is a 59-cabin, all-suite expedition ship. All cabins have an ocean view, en-suite bathroom with marble-topped vanity unit and walk-in shower,

sitting area, spacious wardrobe, safe, minibar, individually controlled heat/air-conditioning, flat-screen television and dressing table. The ship's amenities include complimentary WiFi, a dining room, two lounges with bar service, a small library, an observation deck with comfortable lounge chairs, a hairdresser and laundry service. An elevator services all passenger cabin decks. The *Island Sky*'s chefs prepare quality international meals, predominantly Western-style, served at a single open seating. A friendly crew provides exceptional, personalized service, with more than a 1:2 crew-to passenger ratio. The ship features advanced satellite navigation and communication equipment, roll stabilizers and a fleet of Zodiac landing craft.

WHAT TO EXPECT We consider this to be a moderately strenuous program, at times physically demanding and busy, with considerable walking at some destinations. Daily activities can involve up to two miles of walking, unaided, over varied terrain (e.g., uneven beaches, steep and sandy or muddy trails, dirt streets and paths in small villages), in hot or rainy conditions. You will need to climb into and out of Zodiacs for most excursions. Please note that some locations involve wet landings. All participants should be comfortable swimming unassisted in open water. No prior snorkeling experience is necessary. Participants must be physically fit, active and in good
